**Harborough Local Development Framework
Core Strategy Development Plan Document (DPD)
ADOPTION STATEMENT**

In accordance with Regulation 24(4) and Regulation 36 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004 and the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England)(Amendment) Regulations 2008, notice is given that Harborough District Council adopted its Core Strategy Development Plan Document (Core Strategy) on 14 November 2011.

The Core Strategy sets the vision, spatial strategy and policies for development in the District for the period to 2028. It replaces relevant parts of the Harborough Local Plan 2001. An independent Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, considered the Core Strategy at Examination Hearings between 19 and 28 July 2011. The Inspector's Report, with its recommendations, was published on 1 November 2011.

Any person aggrieved by the Core Strategy may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act (2004). Any challenge must be made on the grounds that either the document has not been prepared within the powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 or that a procedural requirement of the Act or associated Regulations has not been complied with. Any such application must be made promptly and in any event no later than 6 weeks after the date of this notice (ie by 5 January 2012)

The adopted Core Strategy, Inspector's Report, this Adoption Statement, the Sustainability Appraisal Report and the Sustainability Appraisal Adoption Statement (prepared in accordance with the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004 (16) (3) and (4)) are available for public inspection free of charge, at the following locations:
